WHAT IS THE NUNAVUT COMMUNITY AQUATIC MONITORING PROGRAM (N-CAMP)?

The N-CAMP has been developed to train Nunavummiut in basic fisheries and aquatic monitoring techniques. The program is very unique because it is done almost entirely out on the land and the learning is hands on. Data collected will be used for developing and sustaining local fisheries.

Our Vision is "To allow Nunavummiut to be fully engaged as stewards of their aquatic resources, primarily fisheries, through community-based monitoring, training, and sharing Inuit Knowledge and scientific data".

HOW LONG WILL N-CAMP TAKE?

Dates for N-CAMP start by March 18th and should be finished by March 29th. In that time there will be an evening of registration and orientation, followed by 2 classroom days, 5 days out at the lake fishing, and then another afternoon and evening of reviewing our work and having a community feast. This adds up to about 8 days of time needed to participate in the program, but keep in mind that weather can add to this.
